FeNZ Photo and Video Publishing Policy

This policy covers all Fencing New Zealand events and tours, Fencing New Zealand regions and all affiliated clubs.

Photographs and videos are regularly taken at Fencing New Zealand events, regional and club events. These images are often published on social media and Fencing New Zealand or regional websites.

Competition and event organisers must advise that by entering both the competition and the event venue they are providing consent to use their image. This is to be included in event entry forms, and signage advising this is also to be provided at all competition venue entrances.

Consent to use the person's image can be withdrawn at any time, by contacting the competition organisers, or in the case of retrospective withdrawal of consent, by contacting FeNZ directly. A confidential register of any individual not wishing to have images used will be maintained but the tour or event organiser.

The use of cameras is only allowed in open public areas at events and the use of devices in changing rooms or similar private areas is strictly forbidden.

When images are used, either printed or on-line, no personal information other than names should be included without the written permission of the individual, parent or guardian.

Fencing New Zealand will only use appropriate images of individuals related to fencing, and it will ensure all subjects are suitably clothed. Any images should be used positively and promote the sport of fencing.

Live Streaming

The live streaming of FeNZ events by non-organising parties should be approached with caution and approval must be given by FeNZ and event organisers.

Video Referee Footage

All medal matches at FeNZ events are to use video referee technology, as a part of an ongoing drive to improve the quality of fencing and officiating at FeNZ events.

Footage of all medal matches at open level FeNZ events only will be released after the event on a free, open video streaming platform for all to view.

Footage may be also used by FeNZ for coach, referee and fencer education and development.
